Canada-Ukraine Transitional Assistance Initiative (CUTAI)

Many people arrive in Canada under the Canada-Ukraine Transitional Assistance Initiative (CUTAI). If you are part of this program, you can get one-time financial support. It is \$3,000 per adult (18 and older) and \$1,500 per child (under 17). You need to fill out an online application.

Health Care

Ukrainians have been granted emergency approval to come to Canada. This means you have access to health-care support and services. In Ontario, it is the Ontario Health Insurance Plan—often known as OHIP—that covers this.

Apply for a Health Card

You must apply for OHIP in person at a ServiceOntario centre. There is no waiting period and you can apply for coverage as soon as you arrive in Ontario. For more information, call the ServiceOntario INFOline at **1-866-532-3161**.

Ontario Drug Benefit Prescriptions

If you are receiving Emergency Assistance, you and your children will be enrolled in the Ontario Drug Benefit Program. This program can help with costs for many medications.
